Your essay must be in MLA format (MLA header, size 12 font, Times New Roman, double spaced, pages numbered).</p> <p>1) Sophocles' plays are designed to instruct his audience members--even those in positions of authority--about how to behave in a morally correct fashion. <u>Choose two of the three plays and compare and contrast</u> how acting on emotions (jealousy, suspicion, pride, anger, love) leads to negative effects for the characters, while acting in a cautious manner indicates wisdom in the characters.</p> <p>2) The ongoing philosophical debate of whether human life is governed by fate or individual free will is the subject of much of the world's best literature. In a well-organized essay, demonstrate that the fate versus free will puzzle is at the heart of the <i>Oedipus/Oedipus at Colonus/and Antigone</i>. Do not merely summarize the plot.</p>
